Key findings for the June quarter 2014:

- NSW continues to lead Australia in accommodation supply, demand and revenue takings.
- While there has been a slight decline in number of establishments in Australia and in NSW for the June quarter 2014 when compared to the same quarter in 2013, the number of rooms available slightly increased in the State (+0.1%). This was mainly due to growth in room nights available in motels (+1.2%) and hotels (+0.4%).
- NSW revenue for the quarter increased in terms of takings (+2.2%), yield per room (+2.1%) and average room rate (+1.7%). The revenue growth in serviced apartments exceeded NSW revenue growth in all three metrics (+5.1%, +3.9% and +6.9%, respectively).
- While room occupancy rates for the June quarter declined in Australia, NSW occupancy rates grew from 62.6% to 62.8%. The increase in NSW occupancy rate was mostly due to high hotel occupancy rate (up from 73.2% to 74.6%).
- Sydney accounts for 20 per cent of NSW establishments but 49 per cent of NSW rooms. Sydney room nights occupied (+1.7%) increased higher than its room nights available (+0.8%) and this resulted in the high occupancy rate of 77.2%, up from 76.5% in June quarter 2013.
- Regional NSW recorded declines in supply and demand in the quarter but exceeded growth in Sydney revenue takings (+2.3% vs. +2.1%).
- North Coast leads Regional NSW in tourist accommodation. It accounts for more than a fifth of Regional NSW's accommodation supply, demand and revenue takings.
